I, Francis Marion Galloway, of Brunswick County, and State of North Carolina, being in health of body and sound mind, memory and understanding, praise God for the same, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following:

II. I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved Sons Henry Galloway and Richmond Galloway, their heirs and assigns forever, all the lands tenements and hereditaments of which I shall die seized in Brunswick County, State of North Carolina. And further: I give, devise and bequeath unto my above said sons Henry Galloway and Richmond Galloway all of my stock to-wit: Horses, mules, cows, sheep, hogs and poultry. And further: All cereals, cotton plants, potatoes and kinds of forage and the various growing crops; Also all of my house and kitchen furniture. And further: wagons, carts, buggy harness and saddles and farming implements and tools of every description, including all personal and household property not named in this Will.

III. I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved Children to-wit:

1. Catharine Hewitt, relict of Rufus O. Hewitt deceased.
2. Anna Gilbert wife of Wm. J. Gilbert.
3. Henry Galloway
4. Rebecca Rhodes, wife of Isaac B. Rhodes of Wilmington.
5. Richmond Galloway.

a. All the money on hand at my death and remaining after my just debts if any, and funeral expenses have been paid.
b. All the money on deposit in Bank or Banks.
c. All Mortgages and Promissory notes.
To be divided in equal shares among the heirs designated by numbers 1 to 5, as soon as my Executor shall have converted all in to cash and received three hundred dollars (\$300.) out of it which I devise and bequeath unto my son Sam Reuben Owen son of Christopher B. Owen and Romina Owen nee Galloway, both deceased to be paid to above said Reuben Owen by my Executor when he becomes of age (21) years. However, if he should die before that
