FIRST: All of my just debts, if any, and my funeral expenses shall be paid from my Insurance which I carry with The Junior Order United American Mechanics; then the balance of said insurance shall be equally divided among my seven children, viz: B.W. Woodie, James B., Mattie L., Annie W. Hewett, and Laura J. Swain, and Vereshe S. Ward.
