LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

I, Annie O. Robinson, being of sound and disposing mind, do make and publish this to be my last Will and Testament, in manner following:

First: I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executor, hereinafter named, as soon as practicable after my death.

Second: I wish to be buried in the cemetery at Uniontown, Pennsylvania, beside my late husband, William L. Robinson.

Third: I direct that my Executor, hereinafter named, place or cause to be placed, a marker at my grave similar to the one on the grave of my late husband.

Fourth: I hereby give and bequeath the sum of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars in trust to be placed, in the discretion of my Executor, with a trust company or other trustee, the interest or income to be used yearly for the care of the Eleanor Robinson lot in Uniontown Cemetery, Uniontown, Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

Fifth: I give and bequeath unto my brother, John Oliphant, of Chicago, the sum of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars; unto my nieces, Mary G. Oliphant, Harriett O. Simpson, Elizabeth M. Reed, and Harriett D. Oliphant, each the sum of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars; unto my niece, Anna Fox Oliphant, daughter of my late brother, S. D. Oliphant, the sum of five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars; unto my nephew, John D. Oliphant, the sum of one thousand five hundred (\$1,500.00) dollars; unto Edward E. Oliphant the sum of one thousand five hundred (\$1,500.00) dollars; unto my friend, Margaret L. Parkhill, the sum of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars and all books, dishes, rugs and other furniture in the house that she may want, subject to the provisions of paragraph seven hereof; unto my lifelong friend, Mary L. Roberts, the sum of two hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars; unto my friend, Mary E. Roddy, the sum of two hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars. It is my will that in the event of the death of either Miss Parkhill, Miss Roberts, or Miss Roddy before my decease, the share so willed to either of them respectfully shall in such event go to my residuary legatees in proportion as hereinafter set forth, but the other bequests in this paragraph shall not lapse on account of the death of said legatees prior to my decease but shall be payable to their legal heirs. All of the foregoing bequests shall be paid in full without any deduction for any inheritance tax or other death duty which I hereby direct shall be paid out of my estate.

Sixth: I give and bequeath one hundred (\$100.00) dollars to the Presbyterian Church at Southport, North Carolina.

Seventh: As to my wearing apparel, jewelry and other personal articles, including certain articles of table silverware and other furniture, I direct that my Executor make distribution of the same, as he is familiar with my wishes in that regard, but there shall be no charge or deduction therefrom for any inheritance tax or other death duty, which I hereby direct shall be paid out of my estate.

Eighth: All the rest and residue of my estate, real, personal and mixed, I give and bequeath as follows: Two-fifths (2/5) to my Nephew, Eleanor S. Bowie, and three-fifths (3/5) to my niece, Elizabeth Bowie Rough.
