Second: I give and devise to my trusted friend, John W. Fullwood, all of my property, both real and personal, of ever nature and kind, wherever situated, in fee simple, in payment for having furnished me a home for the past fifteen years.

I hereby constitute and appoint John W. Fullwood my lawful executor, to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN: I, Rebecca Fields of said county and state, being of sound mind, and descretion, and of a disposing disposition, do make, publish and declare this paper writing as my last will and testament, hereby expressly revoking and declaring void, all former wills or codicils, by me made.

Item One:----I give and bequeath my soul unto God who gave
Item Two:----I direct that my body be given a decent burial, and that some kind of tomb-stones,--that will forever mark my last resting place, be erected over my grave; and the same to be paid for out of the first monies coming into the hands of my executor hereinafter named:
Item Three:----I desire that all my just debts be paid, should I leave any due at my death, same to be paid out of personal or real, property or monies belonging to my estate.
Item Four:----I give devise and convey in fee simple unto my Beloved children Henryetta Johnson, George Fields, Ida Bethea; Sam Fields; Lizzie Pellam; the heirs at law of Josie Webb; and Benjamin Fields, eight (8) acres to each or my said heirs (making a total of 56 acres) the same to be out off the Eastern end of my home place--where I now reside, in said county and state, adjoining the lands of Geo. O. Gaylord, Cook and Sykes estates, et. al. and to be laid off in the manner of the drawing hereon, and the names of each heir being upon his eight acre share,---to be surveyed out in equal (eight) acre blocks-- as near as practical and convenient, in the manner to wit:

PROVIDED HOWEVER, I, desire and request that share No. 2 to my beloved son George Fields, shall be so surveyed, as to include his home and all his buildings thereabout.

Item Five:---For and in consideration of the special care given me by my beloved son Thomas Fields, and for the love and affection for him, I hereby bequeath give, grant, demise, and convey unto the said Thomas Fields HEIRS SIMPLY, all the residue of my said home place---described in item four---not conveyed in said item; together with all my personal property---subject to the payment of my said debts, if any, my burial expenses and tomb-stones as aforesaid.

Item Six:---I hereby name, nominate, make and declare my said trustee and true son Thomas Fields my full executor, to execute and carry out, this my last will and testament. (THE END)
