Brunswick County. } I, George Davis, of the State and County
aforesaid, being of perfect sound and disposing mind and memory
do make, publish and declare this Instrument of Writing to be
and contain my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other
and former wills & testaments by me heretofore made. In testimony
It is my will and desire that my Executor here in after named
pay all my just debts, and to enable him to do so I do hereby give
him full power & authority to sell and dispose as he may think
proper of any part or the whole of my estate, both real and personal
I give, devise and bequeath unto my sister, Sophia Stokes,
Five hundred dollars to be paid her immediately after the pay-
ment of my said debts. Item, I give, devise and bequeath unto my
Nephew James Alexander Moore, Five hundred dollars to be
paid him upon his arriving to the age of twenty-one years &
in case of his death before the age of twenty-one years then the
said five hundred dollars to go to my Nephew Thos. Frederick Davis
Item, I give, devise and bequeath unto my Niece Sophia Moore, Five
hundred dollars to be paid her upon her arriving at the age of twenty-
one years, or day of marriage whichever shall first happen. And it
is my will and desire that my negro girl named "Lucy" be emancipated
and set free from slavery and it is my particular request to my Execu-
tor that he cause the same to be done either by the County Court or by an
Act of the Genl. Assembly. Item, all the rest and residue of my estate of
whatever kind or nature, whether real, personal or mixed I give, devise
and bequeath unto my brother, Thomas F. Davis, to him, his heirs & assigns
forever. Lastly I do hereby, constitute and nominate and appoint my
said brother Thomas F. Davis, Executor of this my last will & testament.
