Since the within Will and Codicil was written in the year one thousand eight hundred (1879) seventy nine in which I bequeathed my house kitchen together with house hold and kitchen furniture and Lot No 2 as expressed in Plan of Town of Smithville, now called Smithville in Brunswick County, North Carolina. To my beloved wife Elizabeth Price after my demise to have full charge of the same during her life time and then to my children. Since which time, I have been unfortunate and lost all I had to make a living, and since then my daughter Sarah Florence Price, had to keep school and otherwise employed, has had to furnish means to repair house and fence and also support her mother and myself and I now think it proper and just to give to my daughter Sarah Florence Price after her & mother's demise (If she her mother dies first) the house kitchen and house hold, and kitchen furniture consisting bedding, trunks, chairs, carpets, crockery ware and other useful articles with the clear understanding; clearly meaning, that my daughter Mary Elizabeth shall have a life time right to live in the house as a home, during her life time with equal rights but shall not have the right to sell any part of the same, and if Florence shall live the longest, the house, lot and kitchen and furniture, shall all belong
