FIRST: My Executor, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all my funeral expenses, together with all my funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

SECOND: I give and devise to John Albert Norriss, in fee simple, all the land I own on the East side of the Old Stone Chimney Road.

THIRD: I give and devise to Elsie Ford Norriss and Grover Laverne Norriss, in fee simple, all of the land I own on the West side of the said Old Stone Chimney Road, to be equally divided between them, each of them to share and share alike.

FOURTH: I give and bequeath to John Albert Norriss all of my personal property, of whatsoever nature, wherever situated, of which I may die seized and possessed.

FIFTH: I give and bequeath to Minnie Ellen Norriss, the sister of John Albert Norriss, Elsie Ford Norriss and Grover Laverne Norriss, the sum of \$100.00, said sum to be paid in equal parts to the said John Albert Norriss, Elsie Ford Norriss and Grover Laverne Norriss to the said Minnie Ellen Norriss, their sister, before they shall be entitled to take the property bequeathed and devised to them by this will.

SIXTH: I hereby constitute and appoint my trusted friends, B. B. Frink, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
