to fore made. And first and principally I desire my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid as soon after my death as conveniently can be.

After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I give and devise to my wife Mary Ann Corbett all my lands in the County of Brunswick in this State, for and during the term of her widowhood and no longer.

After the death of my wife, or upon her marrying again I give and devise to my son Wesley H. Corbett the tract of land in said County of Brunswick, known as the Drew land, being the same conveyed to me by W. E. Bowditch as Executor of Dr. Frederick J. Will (of which however I sold off one hundred acres to Isaac D. Reynolds) and also another tract of land in said County of Brunswick adjoining the above, Conveyed to me by Sterling P. Reynolds, and containing thirty five acres to hold to him and his heirs forever. My undivided half interest in the house and lot in the City of Wilmington on the North West intersection of Fourth and Worcester Streets, being the Eastern half of lot 6 in block 61. I give and devise to my wife for and during the term of her natural life and after her death then to my daughter Mary C. Taylor wife of J. W. Taylor her heirs and assigns forever; Equally to be divided between them. All the residue of my estate, real and personal, I give, devise and bequeath as follows that is to say, the personally to my wife and the realty to my children. Lastly, I nominate and appoint Fred Reynolds of the County of Brunswick Executor of this my last will and testament.
