her natural life and if he should provide said support
then at her death he shall have and own said property.

Melinda and Faley two dollars each.

3rd I hereby constitute and appoint my son Whitfield Executor
to this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I here-
unto set my hand and seal this the 17th day of June 1893.
