And I do hereby appoint the aforesaid John H. Esquire, sole Executor to this my last Will.

Given under my hand and seal this twentieth day of November in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety five.

Whereas James Read, Esquire, late of the County of Brunswick, deceased, nominated & appointed me the Executor of his last Will & testament, and whereas I have refused to act in pursuance of said nomination and appointment, I do hereby accordingly renounce all right, claim and power to act as Executor of the last Will & testament of the said James Read and hereby authorize this my renunciation to be recorded in the County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions of the County of Brunswick, North Carolina, 24th Jan'y. 1805.

In the name of God, Amen! I, Joseph Jones, of Smithville, Brunswick County, being of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do this twenty sixth day of July in the year of our Lord, One thousand, eight hundred and four, make and publish this my last will and testament, in manner following, that is to say: First, I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife, Mary Jones, a negro man named Ben, and one half of a lot No. 65. in Smithville, being the best part of D. Lot Sixty five with all the improvements thereon—also all my household furniture, and all such moneys as shall be collected for debts due. And I give and bequeath unto my beloved sons Joseph Jones, Augustine Jones, Martin Jones, and Bartholomew Jones, each fifty cents. And I hereby make and ordain my worthy wife Mary Jones Executrix of this my last Will and testament.

In witness whereof, I the said Joseph Jones have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written
