FIRST

My Executor, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my four children, and shall pay my funeral expenses, together with all my just debts; and shall erect a marker to my grave to be selected by my said children, out of the first monies coming into his hands belonging to my said estate.

SECOND

I GIVE AND DEVISE to my daughter, ESTELLE PINNER RUARK, and to her heirs and assigns, in fee simple F O R E V E R, that portion of the tract of land on which I now reside, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

FIRST TRACT

Adjoining the Cottage Tract, the lands of Hankins, Turrentine and bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a pine on Jonathan Swain's upper corner, runs thence east twenty-two chains and thirty six links along Swain's line to a scrub oak, thence north twenty-two chains and thirty-six links to a pine; thence West twenty-two chains and thirty-six links to a red oak near the ford of Buck Branch; thence south twenty-two chains and thirty-six links to the beginning, containing fifty acres, more or less, and being the same originally granted to David Swain, July 11, 1788.

All the rest and residue of my property, both real and personal, or mixed, shall be divided between my four children, ESTELLE PINNER HUARK, EVA PINNER WOLFE, MIRIAM PINNER ALDRIDGE AND JAMES E. PINNER, share and share alike.

I have not made herein any specific devise of real property to my daughter, MIRIAM PINNER ALDRIDGE, for the reason that I have heretofore deeded to her that certain lot, tract, piece or parcel of land upon which she now resides, by way of advancement, that she might enjoy the use thereof without awaiting my demise.

SIXTH

I hereby constitute and appoint my trusted friend, FRED SMALL my executor of this my Last Will and Testament, to execute the same according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking, and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
