- Second. I give and devise to Mary Davis widow of my son Anthony Davis, and also to my grand daughter Rose Davis and Ellen Mitchell a one third interest in all the real property of which I am now possessed or may hereafter become possessed of, and to Richard Davis, Carrie Moore, Martha Moore, Loggie Davis, Willie A. Davis, John W. Davis, Willie Davis, Squire Davis, Thomas Davis, and Anna Davis, the remaining two thirds interest of all the real property of which I am now possessed, or may hereafter become possessed of.
- Third. I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Maria Sears of Beaufort Mass. all money that I have in bank and the interest on same.
- Fourth. I give and bequeath to my grandson Richard Davis and his mother Mary Davis my Horse, Harness and Dray.
- Fifth. I give and bequeath to my grandson Willie Davis my Watch.
- Sixth. My Will and devise is that all the residuum of my estate (if any) after taking out the debts and legacies above mentioned, shall be sold, and the debts coming to me collected, and if there be any surplus over and above the payment of my debts, expenses and legacies, that such surplus shall be equally divided and paid over to my grand children, before named in equal proportion, share and share alike.
- Seventh. I hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend, John Enam, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof. hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.
