Second: We give and devise our son John S. Henry the sum of one dollar.

Third: We give and devise to our son Preston Henry the sum of one dollar.

Fourth: We give and devise to our daughter Helen Galloway the sum of one dollar.

Fifth: We give and devise to our daughter Fannie Henry the sum of one dollar.

Sixth: We give and devise to our son Johnson the sum of one dollar.

Seventh: We give and devise to our granddaughter Fannie Adrian the sum of one dollar.

Eighth: We give and devise unto our son, D. S. Hardy, four certain tracts or parcels of land situated in the County of Brunswick and in the town of townships. Said tracts of land are known as follows:

First tract: Being our home tract on which we reside and containing about fifty acres and lying on the east of land owned in 1861 and 1862 and recorded in the books of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Brunswick County.

Second tract: a tract of land containing about 10 3/4 acres and being the same described in a deed from George W. Bradley and wife to John S. Henry which said deed is dated June 22nd, 1888 and recorded in Book 21, page 97, of the office of the Register of Deeds of Brunswick County.

Third tract: that certain tract or parcel of land conveyed by Ezekiel Skipper and wife Sallie Skipper to John S. Henry which said deed conveying said land is duly recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Brunswick County. Said tract of land containing 3 1/4 acres more or less.

Fourth tract: being a tract of land containing about 10 acres on Town Creek being a tract of swampy land, which said tract of land was conveyed to Lizzie M. Henry wife of John S. Henry by Ezekiel Skipper, and was conveyed by J. H. Bennett April 28th 1886 and a deed is described as follows:

Beginning at a cypress in Town Creek nearly a mile and a half; run with bearing South 40 degrees West 58 poles to a maple at the edge of Ten lines; thence with the edge of Ten lines about South 40 degrees West thirty poles to a black gum at the edge of Ten road into the creek island, thence North 40 degrees East 40 poles to a water oak at the edge of Town Creek; thence with said creek to Ten beginning.

It is particularly understood that neither our daughter or grand daughter mentioned in this ten of our will are to have any control, what ever over the land or premises, but are simply to enjoy the privilege of residing at the same as desired.

Wherby constituted and appointed our son, Preston Henry and S. C. Woodruff, our lawful executors, to execute our said will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, lawfully revoking and declaring void all other wills and testaments by us heretofore made.
