

I, John G. Hall of the County of Brunswick and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, but aware of the uncertainty of human existence, do make and declare this to be my last and testament in manner following:

First I do here by direct my executrix to pay all of my just and lawful debts to whomsoever owing out of the moneys belonging to my estate that shall first come into her hands.

Second I do give, bequeath and devise to my sister Mary Frances Blake, the house and lot, situate in the Town of Fayetteville State of North Carolina, whereupon she now resides, to have and to hold the same during the term of her natural life and said property at her death to revert to my wife Sarah Hall.

Third I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Sarah Hall my plantation in Brunswick County; my plantation in Robinson County and my property in the City of Wilmington, N.C. together with all other personal and real estate of which I may be possessed.

Fourth I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Sarah Hall my sole and lawful Executrix to intents and purposes of this my last Will and testament hereby made and declaring void and of no effect all other Wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
