

In the name of God Amen — I, John Jones of the County of Brunswick and State of North Carolina, being in reasonable health of body, and of sound mind, memory and understanding, praise be God for the same, do make this my last will and testament, in manner and form following:

I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann Jones her heirs and assigns forever, all my property, real, personal and mixed, of what nature or kind soever and wherever the same shall be at the time of my death, subject to the following provisions.

I give and devise unto each of my Children named as follows: The sum of one dollar to be paid out of my personal effects provided, they shall apply to my executor within two years after my death. Richard Jones, Mary Jones, Maria Jones, Godfrey Jones, Equiv Jones and Frank Jones.

I also give devise and bequeath unto my adopted son James Burney the sum of one dollar and should there be a residue of my real and personal property at the death of my beloved wife Ann Jones then and in that event be the said James Burney is to receive the same for his use and behoof.

And I do nominate, constitute and appoint my said wife my sole executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all and every will or wills at any time heretofore made by me and do declare this to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I the said John Jones have hereunto set my hand, this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1884.
