In the name of God Amen — The 20th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty two, I John F. Pigott of Charlotte Township, Gentleman, being, through the blessing of God, in a sound state of mind and memory, but calling to mind the frail tenure of life, and that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament; that is to say, principally and first of all, I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, who gave it me and the dispose of my body I leave to the entire discretion of my friends. With respect to my worldly estate, I give, bequeath, and dispose of it in the manner here following —

Item 1 I hereby give and bequeath to my dearly beloved Daughter Florence C. Pigott all my worldly estate, both real and personal, herein after itemized. To be and remain in the care of my lawful executors until my much beloved Daughter Florence C. attains her twenty-first year, or until she becomes a wife; then all to be paid over, and delivered to her, firmly.

Item 2 I give and bequeath the use and control, of all my worldly estate, to my Dearly beloved Brother James F. whom I make my sole executor of this my last will and testament, all to be kept, used, and controlled by him, in such manner as he may deem best for the interest of my beloved Daughter Florence C. and at the time specified above, to turn all over to her.

Item 3 And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and any other former testaments, by me in any way before named, willed and bequeathed; ratifying and confirming this; and no other, —

to be my last will and testament.

her. I therefore desire the uncertainty of life
and the certainty of death fully given and for-
going all my Right & Natural. Settled on the west
side of the Little Fear River in Brunswick County
and known as Champfield. Being the same as I
got from Mrs Marion Potter, to Edward Williams
to his youngest children Eddie & William to have
and to hold forever. I further bequeath to Edward
Williams the rest of my property consisting of
one 1/1 Lot & Building at Drestrell during her life
after which it is to go to her two youngest children
above mentioned Eddie & William. I further bequeath
and give to Edward Williams all my other property
goods and chattels. to have and to hold forever.
