They would benefit considerably more if the will were denied probate and they call take intestate because the decedent, their great aunt left her surviving only one ister and surviving children of a predeceased brother and sister. Another brother died mildless. Their estimated intestate share would be one-half each of one-sixth of estimated value of the estate of \$1225.00.

But there are no valid objections to the probate of the will berein.
