I Mark Reynolds of Southville in the County of Brunswick and State of North Carolina being of sound disposing mind and memory do make publish and declare the following and no other to be and Contain my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and declaring void all others Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made - That is to say

First

I give devise and bequeath unto my wife Annie for and during her life all my property Real and Personal of every description to have, Hold, use and enjoy with full power to sell and dispose of the whole or any part of the above mentioned property real or personal whenever and in what manner she may think necessary and for her interest

Secondly

At the death of my said wife I give devise and bequeath all of my said property that may remain undisposable of by my wife at the time of her death to Unity Reynolds widow of my brother Isaac Reynolds to be held used and enjoyed during the term of her widowhood,

Thirdly

At the death of the said Unity Reynolds or in the event of her marriage again it is my will and I so declare that all of my said property be divided & equally among the heirs of my brother Isaac Reynolds deceased. Share and share alike.

Lastly

I appoint my nephew Isaac D Reynolds Executor of this my last Will and Testament to carry the same into effect according to its true meaning and intent
