2. I give and devise to my beloved niece Sophia Galloway, for her Natural life to use in any way she may see fit and at Sophia Galloway's death to her sister, Phoenie for and during her natural life to use as she may see fit and at her death the remainder to go to the nearest of kin by the whole blood to the said Sophia and Phoenie Galloway in fee simple to share and share alike, the following described tract of land situate in the city of Southport including the buildings and all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, described as follows:
