I, Mary S. Bruny of Alfis, York County, Maine
do hereby publish and declare the following as my
last will and testament, hereby revoking all former
wills made by me.

First.

I commend my spirit to my God who gave it, and
direct that, if my friends desire it, there shall be a
free medical examination of my lungs by two respect-
able physicians; and that my body be buried in
my cemetery lot beside my father. I also direct
that, immediately after my decease, a telegram
be sent to my brother, George F. B. Lightton,
Gettysburg, Virginia, telling him of my death.

Second.

I give and bequeath to the Congregational
Parish, in Alfis, five hundred dollars, to be
used for the support of a minister in said
Parish.

Third.

I give and bequeath to Samuel A.
Came, of said Alfis, Two hundred dollars,
to be used for the purpose of erecting a mon-
ument, on my cemetery lot for my father and
myself, provided I shall not meet the said
debt during my lifetime; in case I shall meet the
said debt during my lifetime, then this bequest
will go to my residuary legatee.

Fourth.

I direct my executor to allow my
nephew George Lightton to retain the first thousand
dollars he now owes me, (said George giving his note
therefor) provided said nephew shall punctually pay
in lieu of interest on said note, the sum of two
hundred dollars semi-annually to my brother
George F. B. Lightton, during my brother's lifetime;
in case my nephew does not make such payments
punctually as above, then I direct my executor
to make such payments; and wish my brother
to have the two hundred dollars every six months
without fail. At the decease of my brother
I give and bequeath said first thousand dollars
in equal shares to my said nephew George
Lightton, and my niece Mrs. Elattie Brunson,
wife of B. F. Brunson. I give my niece Mrs. Annie
Carp, nothing, believing that she has been well
provided for by my sister Mrs. Francis Cannon.

Fifth.

I give and bequeath to Charles H. Lewis of
Portland Two hundred dollars for the use of my

so long for me without pay, provided he shall present no bill against my estate. I also give James H. Chaboune of South Carolina one hundred dollars, and said James to have three hundred dollars for the same reason, and upon live conditions as the bequest to said Lewis.

All the rest of my property, after the payment of my just debts, funeral charges and costs of administration, I give, devise, and bequeath to my nephew George Lightfoot, his heirs and assigns forever.

I hereby appoint Joseph Parsons of Newbern sole executor of this will.
