First.

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I, Mary L. Brumley of Alpine, Monong County, willed
to make, publish and declare the following as my
last will and testament, hereby revoking all former
wills made by me.

I commend my spirit to my God who gave it, and
trust that, if my friends desire it, there shall be a
post mortem examination of my lungs by two respectable
physicians; and that my body be buried in
my cemetery lot beside my father. I also desire
that, immediately after my decease, a telegram
be sent to my brother, George T. B. Leighton,
Charleston, Virginia, telling him of my death.

I give and bequeath to the Congregational
Parish, in Alpine, five hundred dollars, to be
used for the support of a minister in said
Parish.

Second.

I give and bequeath to Samuel A.
Cane, of said Alpine, five hundred dollars,
in trust for the purpose of meeting a
sum, on my cemetery lot for my father and
myself, provided I shall not meet the same
during my lifetime; in case I shall meet the
same during my lifetime, then this bequest
will go to my residuary legatee.

Third.

I direct my executors to allow my
nephew, George Leighton to retain the first thousand
dollars he now owes me, (said George giving his note
therefor) provided said nephew shall punctually pay
in full, interest on said note, the sum of two
hundred dollars semi annually to my brother
George T. B. Leighton, during my brother's lifetime,
in case my nephew does not make such payment
punctually as above, then I direct my executors
to make such payment; and wish my brother
to have the two hundred dollars every six months
without fail. At the decease of my brother then
I give and bequeath said first thousand dollars
in equal shares to my said nephew, George
Leighton, and my niece, Mrs. Matilda Brumley,
wife of B. A. Brumley. I give my residuary
trust nothing, believing that she has been well
provided for by my sister, Mrs. Frances Cannon.

Fourth.

I give and bequeath to Charles W. Lewis of
Benton, three thousand dollars, for doing the work

so long for me without pay, provided he shall present no bill against my estate. Sales give James W. Chas bound of State Carolina one hundred dollars, and said Parmer it is binded three hundred dollars for the same reason, and upon like conditions as the request to said Lewis.

All the rest of my property, after the payment of my just debts, funeral charges and costs of administration, I give, devise, and bequeath to my nephew George Brightton, his heirs and assigns forever.

I hereby appoint Joseph Parsons of Kennebunk sole executor of this will.
