I Jacob N. Evans of the County of Brunswick in the State of North Carolina being of sound disposing mind and memory, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say.

First I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Gaston the lands to wit, commencing at the mouth of a lake on Iron Creek near the old Shingle Landing on Town Creek running thence a Northwesterly course to the mouth of Mud Branch, up said Branch to a ditch, near the old Place; thence with said ditch to the Pond, thence with a strands of ponds to the ford going to the Pedrick place, thence a Northwesterly course to a large pine at the head of a Branch a marked pine or corner, thence a Northwesterly course to the old corner on Dr. Henry's line, thence down the said Henry's line to the Creek, thence of the said Creek to the beginning - Also one bedstead and its necessary furniture.

Second I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Caroline Amelia the lands to wit, beginning at a pine on the old Rock Creek road near the branch, that Pine is an old corner pine, thence down said Branch to a ditch near the corner of the old place, thence about a Southwesterly course to the Southwesterly corner of the Low Land Ditches, thence down the western ditch to the old field Branch, thence down said branch to where the said branch joins the creek swamp, thence about a Southeastwardly course to the mouth of a lake near the old Shingle Landing on Iron Creek, thence up said creek to N. H. Evans' line, thence with his line to his corner on Turkey Creek branch, thence with the said branch to the beginning. Also my beloved daughter Caroline Amelia shall have a right to a home in my residence left to my wife Jane Franklin during her single lifetime. The Island Fields in said tract of land is reserved for my beloved wife Jane Franklin during her widowhood. After her marriage or death they are to be returned to Caroline Amelia. The old plantation road leading from my residence to the said Island Fields shall be kept open. Also one bed, bedstead and its necessary furniture.
