Third: my executor hereinbefore named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends, and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts, out of the first money which may come into his hands, particular reference being had to certain insurance money hereinafter referred to,

Second: it is my will and as therewith do devise and bequeath to my brother Moses Hiltz of New West, North Carolina, and my sister Willis Taylor of Island, North Carolina, all money received from a life insurance policy in the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company for the sum of Two Hundred & Fifteen Dollars, the said amount to be equally divided between my said brother & sister.

Third: it is my will and I therefore do devise and bequeath to my beloved father, David J. Hiltz of Wilmot, North Carolina, all money that has been received on policy of Two Hundred and fifteen Dollars held by me in the Metropolitan Life Insurance company, it being my desire however that out of this money shall be paid my funeral expenses.

Fourth: I give, devise & bequeath to my husband John Hallis, of Island North Carolina, the sum of One Dollar.

Fifth: all of the rest and residue of my estate, both real & personal, & wherever the same may be situated I give, devise, and bequeath to my beloved father, David J. Hiltz, of New West North Carolina.

Sixth: I nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved father, David J. Hiltz of Wilmot, North Carolina, executor of this my last will and testament, without bond, with the full confidence that my said father will faithfully execute my last will & testament, according to the true intent and meaning thereof.
