

Robert P. Hall, deceased. Will. July Term, 1826.  
State of Tennessee. Williamson County, Franklin, June 29th, 1826.

No. 120

In the name of God, Amen! I, Robert P. Hall, Slave  
of Brunswick County, North Carolina, being of sound memory  
and mind (though sick in body), do make and constitute this my  
last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me  
made, in manner & form following - to wit: - 1. Item. I will and  
bequeath unto my father and mother should they both be living at  
my estate, whether real, personal or any other denomination whatever  
in this will, not hereafter disposed of. And I further will and bequeath  
unto my brother, Ezekiel Hall's three children, after my mother's death  
all my slaves not hereafter disposed of, to wit, Samuel Hall, Marion  
Hall and William H. Hall. 2. Item. I will & bequeath unto  
brother Thomas P. Hall a negro man by the name of Bristol, and  
also 1200 Dollars in money due me from my brother William Hall  
for land sold him. 3. Item. I will and bequeath unto my brother  
William Hall the balance of my land. 4th. Item. I will & bequeath  
unto Elizabeth H. Ash, a negro man named Ned, and a negro girl  
named Judith - otherwise such two slaves as shall be of the value of 100  
Dollars each to be chosen by her, and purchased by my Executor.  
5th. Item. I will and bequeath unto my brother Ezekiel Hall, m.  
of South Carolina, all my notes, accounts and other debts of any  
denomination whatsoever together with all my property not  
before disposed of in this will. 6th. Item. I will and bequeath  
unto my friend James F. McRae a good saddle horse. 7th. Item. I will  
and bequeath unto Mrs. McRae 100 Dollars worth of mourning jewelry.  
8th. Item. I do hereby appoint my brother Ezekiel Hall the  
executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 29th day of  
June, 1826. John L. Wheaton.
