First: My executrix hereinafter named, shall give my body a suitable burial, pay all my funeral expenses, together with my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into her hands, belonging to my estate.

Second: I give and devise to my beloved mother, Alice Davis, all the real property, or interest in real property owned by me at the time of my death, for and during her natural life.

Third: I give and devise to my beloved mother, Simon P. Davis, after the life estate to my mother, as devised in item "second", the remainder of all my real estate or interest in real estate, wherever the same may be found, to have and to hold, to him and his heirs forever, in fee-simple.

Fourth: I give and bequeath to my beloved mother, Alice Davis, and my beloved brother, Simon P. Davis, share and share alike, all my personal property wherever the same may be found, particularly the proceeds from and life insurance that may be in force at the time of my death. It is my will that the proceeds from the policy in the Franklin Insurance Company, of Hartford, Connecticut, which is made payable to my estate, shall be thus divided equally between my mother and my said brother, share and share alike.

Fifth: I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved mother, Alice Davis, my lawful executrix to

to all intents and purposes, without fraud, to execute this my last will and testament according to the intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
