Last Will & Testament:

- First. My Executrix herein after named, shall give my body a burial suitable to her wishes and according to the station of life in which I live, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into her hands belonging to my estate.
- Second. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Emma, all my personal property to be used by her to the best advantage of my children and herself and in any way that she may see fit to use it or dispose of it, which she may deem best.
- Third. I give and devise to my children all my real property save the house and lot on Day Street between Moore and Nash, and which I recently bought of A. J. Robbins to my wife, Emma, to be used by her for the benefit of my children, and she is hereby directed and authorized to sell it whenever she may so think best, and use the funds arising from said sale as she thinks for the best interests of my children.
