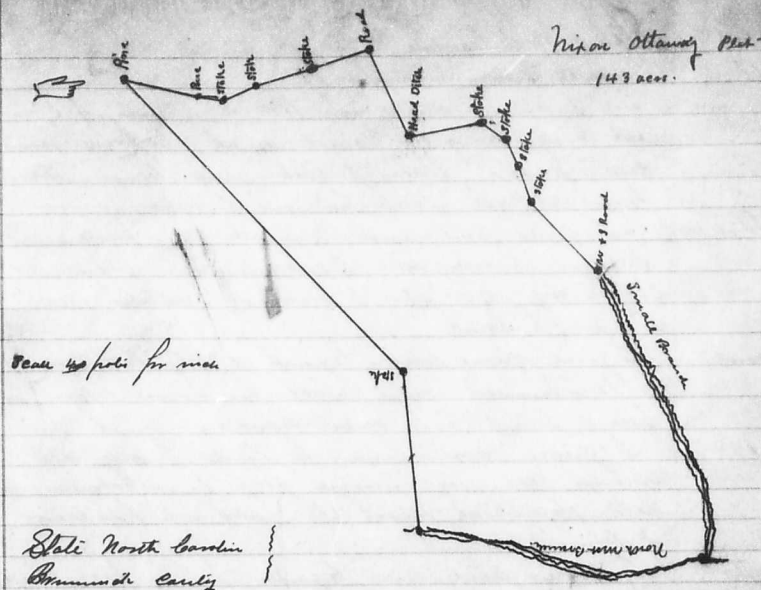

The above diagram represents 140 aco. of land  
divided for mian ollang lands and described as follows.

Beginning at a fine attorney and Durant's corner,  
run South  $76^{\circ}$  East 32 poles to a spruce pine at the mouth of old ditch  
thence South  $95^{\circ}$  East with said ditch 11 poles to a beam in said ditch.  
Thence North  $67^{\circ}$  East 15 poles to said ditch, Thence North  $75^{\circ}$  East with said  
ditch 22 poles to its head. Thence North  $70^{\circ}$  East 26 poles to the Forgettenish  
road. Thence with said road South  $20^{\circ}$  East 26 poles to the head  
of an other old ditch, Thence North  $80^{\circ}$  East 32 poles to a stake  
at the head of a ditch leading into a cypress pond, Thence  
with said ditch South  $58^{\circ}$  East 12 poles. Thence South  $24^{\circ}$  East  
12 poles to a head of said ditch, Thence South  $16^{\circ}$  East 16 poles to  
where the line intersect the old ditch Thence South  $40^{\circ}$  East  
40 poles to the Wilmington and Georgetown road at the head of a  
small branch, Thence down said branch to Stewart's Mill Pond.  
Thence with said pond up North west branch to the Wilmington and  
Georgetown road, a water oak, Thence said road North  $5^{\circ}$  West 68 poles  
to a stake near the Forgettenish road. Thence North  $44^{\circ}$  West 271 poles  
to the beginning.
