In the Name of God, Amen! I, Sedgwick Springs of Brunswick County, State of North Carolina, being of sound perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do, this twenty second day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, make and publish this my last Will & Testament in the manner following, that is to say, First, I give and bequeath unto my wife Lucy Springs all the property which I possess, consisting of the following items - viz: - One house in the Town of Bolivia known in the plan of said town as lot number 37, and another lot in said town, known as Lot No. two(2), also 1 sideboard, 1 Bureau, 1 Dining-table, 1 Tea-table, 1 Cupboard, 1 cot, 1 Bed, 7 chairs, 2 pairs long & short shovels, 3 pitchers, 2 bowls, 1 bowl, & 3 Stone Pots, to have & to hold said property during her natural life, and after her death to be divided equally among my children & grand children. viz: - Mary A. Spruill, Ruth L. Springs, Sallie J. Springs, Julia A. Bellars and the heirs of my son Tom Springs - and I hereby make & ordain my worthy friend Wm. R. Coker, Executor of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I, the said Sedgwick Springs have to this my last will & testament, my hand & seal the day & year above written. Sedgwick Springs, signed, sealed, published & declared by the said Sedgwick Springs, Testator, as his last will & testament in the presence of us who are present at the time of signing & sealing thereof, R. J. Potter & John G. Barford, of Sedgwick Springs of Brunswick County, State of North Carolina do make this codicil to be taken as part of my last will & testament as follows, that is to say, Whereas, in my last Will & Testament I have made & bequeathed an equal division of my personal property (after the death of my wife, Lucy Springs) between the said heirs of Lemuel Springs and my children Mary A. Spruill, Sallie J. Springs, Ruth L. Springs & Julia A. Bellars. Now I do hereby order and declare that my wife is, that only the half of lot number two(2) be given to the heirs of Lemuel Springs with the house & improvements now appertaining thereto, that the remaining half of said lot with the other personal property be divided between my aforesaid children in the following manner, it being desire that during my present illness I have been a hindrance in the execution of my last will & testament.

In the Name of God, Amen! I, John H. Holmes, of the county of Brunswick, State of North Carolina, being in infirm health, but of sound, disposing memory, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit: - I commend my soul to Christ Jesus, the sinners friend, casting my all upon his atoning sacrifice made for poor helpless sinners, hoping in the general resurrection to awake in his likeness & be forever with the Lord.

It is my will and desire that as soon after my decease as practicable my Executors hereafter named shall pay away just debts, which are not many. It is my will and desire that my Executors pay over to my Mother, Mary M. Holmes the sum of Two Hundred fifty dollars each & every year she may live after my decease for her support to be paid quarterly. It is my will and desire that the balance of my property of every kind & description be placed at the disposal of my Executors to be managed by them as they may deem most advantageous for the benefit & support of myself and two sons - John Wright & Walker Davis Holmes and they are hereby authorized & empowered to sell, convey, let and mortify for any part or parts of my property, and make such purchases & investments as they may think best. It is my will and desire that should it become necessary to make a division of the estate before the boys arrive at the age of twenty one years, that they shall share & share alike, my wife holding her undivided portion of the estate of the my heirs and I hereby nominate & appoint as Executor to carry my last will & testament my friend John Newell, Esq., to act in my stead. Dr. Tom H. Wright, a citizen of the town of New Bern, North Carolina, and his wife Anna, to act as my executors if Dr. Wright should die before me. I have this day signed and affixed my seal to my last will & testament.
