First.

I, give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Minnie Hewitt all of my property both personal and real during the term of her natural life or widowhood and should she remarry then and in that event her life estate shall terminate and all of said property shall vest in and be the property of my beloved son George Hewitt and he shall, upon that condition, to wit, the remainder of my said beloved wife, have the control, ownership and possession and dominion of said property but as long as my said wife remains a widow and unmarried, she shall for the term of her natural life, own, possess, control and have dominion over all of my said property aforesaid, except as hereinafter set forth.

I, give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved son George Hewitt all of my property both personal, real or mixed wherever situated or located and of whatever description or kind in fee simple forever, subject nevertheless to the life estate of my beloved wife Minnie or her widowhood as herein

Third.

I, give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Minnie Hewitt to her absolutely, freed from any and all claims, all my Bank Stock, of whatever name called in fee simple forever.

Fourth.

I, give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved son Lord George Hewitt all my property both personal, real or mixed wherever situated or located and of whatever description or kind in fee simple forever, subject nevertheless to the life estate of my beloved wife Minnie or her widowhood as herein set forth in my will herein.

Fifth.

I, have already made ample provision for all of my other children and have given to each of them their ample part of my property and estate.

Sixth.

I, hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend Geo. F. Fowl, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
