IN THE NAME OF GOD, Amen! I, Stephen Williams,  
the County of Brunswick County and State of North Carolina  
do make & order this my last will and testament. First, I give &  
bequeath to my wife Polly Williams one negro man slave named  
Simon, and one negro girl slave named Rachel with her future  
increase, during her life; after the decease of my wife the said  
I give to my sons John & James Williams to be equally divided  
between them, slave & share alike agreeable to their value; and  
I furthermore give to my wife the choice of two featherbeds with  
sufficient bed clothing for the same, one more named Fly, one  
of oxen, the choice of three cows & calves, three sows & pigs, one  
ox cart, spinning Wheel & Loom, together with such part of my  
household & kitchen furniture as she may choose, with sufficient  
sufficient provision for herself, negroes & stock as may be ne-  
cessary for one year, with Dower in my lands including my  
House & all buildings attached to the same. Second - I give & bequeath  
to my son Zadock Williams, this time, one negro woman slave  
Betty & her child, together with her future increase; Third - I give  
bequeath to my son John Williams, this time, one negro man slave  
named Peter, and also my house clock; Fourth - I give & bequeath  
to my son James Williams, & his heirs, one negro boy slave named  
Charles. Fifth - I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Williams  
one negro girl slave named Charlotte, to her & her posterity, and  
if my daughter should die without issue, then & in that case, it is my  
will & desire that the said slave shall go to my grandchild James  
Washington Williams. Sixth - I desire my negro woman slave named  
Betty shall be sold to best advantage & the money arising from  
to be equally divided between my grandchildren Stephen & John  
Minty share & share alike. I desire the remainder of my other  
household & kitchen furniture together with the crop that is  
bequeathed to my wife, shall be sold by my Executor herein  
named and the proceeds from the same to be equally divided between  
my wife and children slave & share alike, after one hundred  
dollars shall be deducted from the same, which said hundred  
dollars I hereby bequeath to my daughter Nancy Williams.  
Eighth - I give and bequeath to my son James Williams the  
my plantation on which I reside after the death of his  
Mother. I desire that my lands on the head of Jumping Branch  
be sold and the proceeds equally divided between my children  
share & share alike. Lastly, I nominate & appoint my wife  
Polly Williams and my son James Williams, Executrix & Testator  
to this my last will & testament, as witness my hand & seal  
this the day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand  
eight hundred and forty three. Stephen Williams.

State of North Carolina, } Know all persons, that I, Daniel  
Brunswick County, } Heir of the County & State aforesaid,  
being of sound mind & memory, but advanced in  
years & of feeble health & believing my earthly existence  
near its end, do make this my last Will & Testament in  
written form following, to wit, - In the first place I do  
that all my property of whatever kind now in together on the  
plantation where I now live until my son Armstrong Williams  
shall become of age for the joint benefit of my wife, Daniel  
and his children till such time that he shall be of age himself  
born viz., Oliver, Lydia, Mary and Armstrong, & also  
my wife Daniel, making a sum then further amounting to  
one thousand dollars from my part of my property
