LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF

I, T. M. HICKMAN, SR., of the aforesaid State and County, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament.

FIRST: My executor, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into their hands belonging to my estate.

SECOND: I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved son, Wallace Hickman, all of my real property of whatsoever nature, wheresoever situate of which I may die seized and possessed, reserving however, a right for my beloved wife, Sallie Hickman, the right to live on said property during her natural life.

THIRD: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all of my personal property which I may die seized and possessed of, to do with as she may see fit during her life time and at her death same shall go to my beloved son, Wallace Hickman.

FOURTH: I hereby constitute my beloved son, Wallace Hickman, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof - hereby revoking and declaring void all other wills and testaments heretofore by me made.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, the said T. M. Hickman, Sr., do hereunto set my hand and seal, this the 28 day of September, 1941.

I, Elizabeth H. Ames, make here my last will and testament, this twenty-third day of November, nineteen hundred, fifty.

After payment of all my debts, I bequeath to my dear husband, John R. Ames, any and all farm lands of which I die possessed, also one half of my undesignated Government Bonds, with the following possible exception. To Marion S. Hall of the County of Accomack, I bequeath the sum of 500.00 (five hundred) dollars to be paid from my bank account, if there is enough left after paying my debts. Failing that, the 500.00 is to be paid from Government Bonds, before they are distributed.

To my dear son, Richard H. Ames, I bequeath all of my stocks, and one half of my undesignated Government Bonds, also my interest in a ground rent in Cinquanti (see letter in Safety Deposit box), - the Government Bonds being subject to possible exception as previously noted.

To my son, Richard H. Ames, I bequeath also all heir looms from my family, and suggest that he keep them at least two years, before disposing of them in any way.

I suggest to my son that he transfer to his wife, Catherine A. Ames, one thousand dollars to use at her own discretion.

I hereby appoint my husband, John R. Ames, and my son, Richard H. Ames as executors, and ask that they be excused from giving bond.
