White was of sound mind and memory, of full age, he was a man and was not under any restraint to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent. And further these deponents say not.

In the name of God, Amen,
I Uriah Carroll being in sound mind and good memory, but knowing it is appointed to all men to die do declare this my last will and Testament.

I give and bequeath to William C. Carver a certain tract of land situated and being in the county of and State aforesaid on the North side of Lewis Swamp in the big bend adjoining the land of Samuel Proun. Beginning at an oak near said Proun corner at the run of said Swamp running thence North Seventy west one hundred and forty poles to a pine thence South twenty west ^{eighty} poles to a stake in said run thence with the same to the first station containing seventy five acres more or less. The same being conveyed to Uriah Carroll by deed from George W. Robin and wife Letitia a Robin bearing date 30th day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty six.

Slaves

I give and bequeath to Andrew J. Carroll fifty two acres of land in county and State aforesaid joining the lands of Samuel and Isaac Proun on Bee tree branch, beginning at an spruce pine in Samuel Proun corner in said branch run thence North thirty seven east ninety poles to a pine Miles Potters corner run thence South Sixty West forty two poles to a pine west of said branch thence West one hundred poles to a lightwood stump said to be in said Isaac Proun line thence South twenty one poles east forty eight poles to a pine William Proun corner thence his line South seventy east one hundred and thirty two poles to said Samuel Proun line in Lewis Swamp thence along his line to the beginning containing fifty two acres more or less. The same being granted to Uriah Carroll by the state of North Carolina bearing date September 7th 1876 grant signed by members of State December 20th 1849 said grant is registered in Brunswick County in book P, + page 175 and 176 I do declare this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills.
