That my executors (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent but not expensive burial, and pay all funeral expenses together with all my just debts, however and to whomsoever owing, out of the money that may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my estate, but not to include the debt欠 my beloved Sister Susan J. Rawson), to her if living - if not living to the children of her body. I request all of my real estate of whatever character or value located as I consider that whatever I may possess as such was gained and held by and through the use of her money.

If it is my desire that the real estate be not sacrificed, but to be held for a reasonable length of time of considerable necessary to be able to earn all of my indebtedness, and to get the benefit of any rise in values of property in and around Southport, in which I have the utmost faith.

I give devise and bequeath to my beloved Dr. Vance Rawson my entire library with this one, the mahogany desk in my sitting room is the property of Miss Leslie Worthington, the balance of my personal property of whatever character which can not be properly or satisfactorily divided to be sold in such manner as best to my executors, and after paying to my beloved Niece by marriage Leslie D. Worthington to whom I bequeath the sum of one hundred dollars the balance of the proceeds of such sale of personal effects to go to my brother Jas. S. Pyke or to his children if he be not living.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint as long as New City stands, and the gift of it to me in return I have every confidence in

lawful executors to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof, thereby revoking and declaiming utterly void all other wills or testaments by me hitherto made.

And I hereby declare it as my wish that my executors do not give any bond for the faithful performance of their duty, and that they be given a free hand, to manage the estate as in their judgment seems best.

Item Four.

I direct that any and all sum of money due me from the United States for service, or on any other account be paid to my Executor, to be discharged by me herein directed.

Item Five.

I give and bequeath to my beloved nephew Clyde Boykin, my watch and chain.

I give devise and bequest to my beloved niece, Helen Bell, daughter of my sister, Charles Bailey of Hartington, Florida, all the real estate in her name and to my wife, as well as all
