I, William Paterson of Brunswick County, of the State of North Carolina, mariner, being in a low state of health, but of perfect mind and memory, thank be given unto God, calling into mind the mortality of my body, and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executrix, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form:

I give and bequeath to Mary, my dearly beloved wife, whom I likewise constitute, make and ordain the sole Executrix of my last will and testament, all and singular my real and personal estate, and I hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other former testaments, wills, legacies, bequests and Executors by me in any wise before named, wills and bequeaths, ratifying and confirming this and useth to my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 27th day of May, 1803.

State of North Carolina - In the Name of God, Amen!

I, Sarah Howe, of the State aforesaid, and County of Brunswick, being of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do this day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety six, make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following - that is to say - First, I give and bequeath to my son Robert Howe, his heirs and assigns forever, all that part of my property which I purchased of him negroes, furniture and stock &c. &c. which will more fully appear in a bill of sale from him, to said Robert, to me, dated Sept. 21st 1799. and schedule thereto annexed. Secondly, I give to my grandchildren Sarah Daniel, ~~John Daniel, Elizabeth Daniel, John Daniel~~, as a token of my affection, ~~John Daniel~~ given through my beloved daughter Mrs. Ann Goodlet Daniel and in full consideration of what I intended to leave giving her had she lived, one Johannes Africa to be paid them as soon as it may be possible after my decease. Thirdly, All the rest of my estate of every kind whatever, lands, negroes, furniture, stock and monies which are now or may be due me hereafter, I give, devise and bequeath to my daughter Mary Cloose and my son Robert Howe, to them their heirs and assigns forever to be equally divided between them, and I hereby make and ordain my son Robert Howe Executor of this my last will and testament.
