First, I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Christina all my household & kitchen furniture except one Bureau which belongs to my daughter Sarah, my horse, fifteen head of sheep, fifteen head hogs & three head of cattle and all movable effects for and during her natural life, and after her death to be equally divided among her children,

Secondly, I desire my son Jacob to take my land I bought on Little Sandy Marsh and pay for it and live on the same and maintain my wife Christina and all the family that is unmarried on the above mentioned lands until they be fit to leave home or become of age,

In the name of God amen - I Ann Tidwell of the County of Brunswick and State of North Carolina being of sound and disposing mind & memory, but feeling it mine that it appertaineth for all to see, do make, ordain, constitute & establish this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say,

Item 1st I will and bequeath to my grandson John G. Patton his heir and assigns forever, two negro men to wit, Augustus about 24 years of age, and Grant about 17 years old.

Item 2nd, I will and bequeath that all the balance of the property which I may own at the time of my death be sold by my executor herein after named, in a Credit of twelve months, and that the proceeds of such sale, after paying all my just debts funeral expenses &c be divided into twelve equal parts, and be given one part to my daughter Hannah Seavey, one part to the children of my deceased daughter Elizabeth Daniel, and one part to the children of my deceased son William A. Patton, one part to the children of my deceased daughter

Sarah Seavey, one part to my daughter, one part to my son Robt. H. Patton, one part to my son John G. Patton, one part to my son George G. Patton, and the other part to be at Heaven. Should any my will is that there be no division if living, during my life, or within three years of this will,
