

Will Pocket To Oct Term 1849!

The last Will & Testament of Ann White Deceased.

State of North Carolina, Wayne County.

I, Ann Eliza White, being of sound and perfect mind do make this my last Will & Testament. First I will my body to the dust, and my soul to God, who gave it. I next Will to my Brother Laurence Sabagaw all he owes me, which is set forth in a note of hand he gave me when me & him settled.

I will to my Brother Matthias Sabagaw, after he pays to my estate Four Hundred Dollars, all the balance of what he owes me. I next will to

my Sister Sarah Swafford, my Cloak, one bed, two quilts, two sheets & pillows, I next Will to the use of the gospel and for the Spreading of the same, all the cash I now have in my possession, which I believe is about twenty or thirty Dollars, which I want to be given to the needy poor preachers of the gospel; after this I Will and bequeath all the balance of my property & effects to my Brother Geo W Sabagaw's three children - Napoleon J. Sabagaw, Andrew J. Sabagaw & Ann Eliza Sabagaw, all of which to be spent in the Education of them, if necessary, and if any is left after that to be divided equally between them, and in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 6th Day of June 1848
