Then: In case however it shall so happen

depart this life before reaching the age
of twenty-one years, and without having
issue living at her death, then I give
devise and bequeath all my estate
aforesaid to my sister Susan B. Robertson
her heirs, executors and administrators,
I make these dispositions of my property
feeling entire confidence that my daughter
and sister will care for the comfort of
my dear and honored father.

Lastly: I constitute, nominate and
appoint my sister Susan B. Robertson
executrix of this my last will and

herby making all other wills by me made.
Also I appoint my sister Susan personal
Guardian of my daughter during her minority.
