

I Daniel Brown, of the County of Buncombe and City of Asheville, Being of Sound mind and full understanding the meaning, and effect of what I am doing, having well considered and matured the same, do make and declare this my last Will and testament to wit,

I direct and will that I. Shall be decently buried, and that memorial or Tomb Stones Shall be placed at my grave to be selected by my. Executor suitably to my Station in life and such other attentions as may be necessary to make my last resting place pleasant to my friends,

I Will that my Executor Shall Sell my property (to wit) a House and Lot in the north west part of Asheville on Madison Street known as No 15, Containing three fourths of an acer, on such terms and in such manner as he may think best, either at Public or private Sale, and that he shall dispose of the proceeds as follows, that is to say first He shall pay to Francis Brown Fifty dollars, Second to Mary Wilson, Two thirds of balance, and third to William Wilson, one third of balance, and lastly I appoint my true friend

Executor of this my last Will and Testament, not doubting that he will fully observe, and execute my wishes and properly account for all things, which comes to his hands as such Executor Signed this day of 1891

And the Deponent further saith, that the said Daniel Brown. the testator aforesaid, did at the time of subscribing his name as aforesaid declare the said paper writing so subscribed by him and exhibited to be his last Will and Testament, and this deponent did thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said will as an attesting witness thereto, and at the request and in the presence of the said testator, And this deponent further saith, that at the said time when the said testator subscribed his name to the said last Will as aforesaid, and at the time of deponent's subscribing his name as an attesting witness thereto, as aforesaid, the said Daniel Brown, was of Sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a will, and was not under any restraint to the knowledge information or belief of this deponent; And further these deponents say not.
