 child's part of my personal Estate.

Item 2nd I will to my Children, all the rest of my Estate, not herein

 accounts.

Item 3rd My executors may or may not sell any or all of my property
 real and personal, as shall seem to them most advisable, so as not to
 affect the value of the same.

Item 4th I do hereby Constitute and appoint my Dear wife, and Sam^l
 B. Judger, Executors & Executrix of this my will. J. W. Candler general counsel.
