I bequeath and devise to my wife Cordelia M. Erwin West all of my property, both real and personal of every kind and description whatsoever, in case I die before she does, unconditionally and without reserve, giving her full power to dispose of any or all of it at her discretion by due will or otherwise.

But in case my said wife Cordelia M. Erwin West should die before I die, then and in that event I bequeath and devise my property as follows.
