known what I wish done with any
property I may leave at my decease as
made and publish this my last will
and testament.

First -

I give and bequeath to my son Howard
Banks my gold watch which I desire to be
left with my wife Annelle Banks until she
is satisfied he is competent to take proper
care of it and properly to appropriate its value.

Second -

I give and bequeath my library of books
to whichever of my sons it may please the
Lord to call to the Gospel Ministry, if both
are thus called, then I desire it shall be
divided between them; provided it should
not become necessary to sell it for the
means of living.

Third -

All the property (except what is mentioned
in items first and second) that I may
leave at my decease, of whatever character,
either real, personal or mixed, I give to
execute hereinafter named to be held
and appropriated as hereinafter directed.

I wish all of said estate to be kept in
trust and the income thereon used for the
support of my family, consisting of my
wife and three children in common, until
the youngest of my children shall have
reached his majority, after which it shall
rest in the wife Annelle Banks, and fourth
daughter Mary Estelle Banks -

Fourth - I desire my executors as soon as soon
as it may be practical to and as much of
the effects of my estate as may be
necessary to invest in a house for my wife

and children to be used in common by them, the
locality, cost and manner of which shall be determin-
ed by my said executors after consultation with
my wife.

Fifth -

To execute and carry out the provisions of this
will, I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends
J. P. Gammon and A. T. Sumner of Asheville N.C.
and do earnestly request them to become joint
executors of this my last will and testament
praying that they may have divine wisdom
and guidance in the management of the affairs
committed to their trust.
