Item: 1. I will that my Executors

unpaid

Item: 3. I will and bequeath to my Executors

directed to sell all of my estate of every
description to the highest bidder for cash -
They will sell my real estate in parcels
or lots - The lot and store now rented
to W. H. Penland to be sold in one parcel
The lot West of that and store in another
parcel - They will survey off and sell
one lot the size of each of the last named
two, and each of them and sell in one
parcel and the balance of the lot on which
I now live, including the store in one
parcel, and each and every other tract
of land of which I may die seized
parcels and make sale

my personal estate and with the proceeds pay off my funeral expenses and debts, if I should leave any unpaid, and they will distribute the proceeds as may be herein after directed

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza and her heirs one seventh of the effects of my estate after deducting from said estate a legacy made for her and my debts and expenses of the execution of this my will.

I also will to her during her life or widowhood a home consisting of a house and lot in the town of Asheville which my Executor, an empowereed and directed to buy for her as she may select, not to exceed in value fifteen hundred dollars, and they will take title to such house and lot upon the conditions with acquiescence to the other legatees as named herein.)

Item 5. I will and bequeath and devise the bal of my entire estate as follows to each of my brothers and sisters or to the children of such as may not survive me as follows: to Mr. Johnston, Robert Johnston, Jackson Johnston, Benjamin Johnston, Elizabeth Gilliespie, and the heirs of my deceased sister Mary Gudgeon such share and share alike, making one seventh to each of my brothers and sisters or the children of such and to each one undivided seventh of the remaining interest in the house and lot provided to be bought for my wife said division of my estate is to be made after deducting debts and expenses and the fifteen hundred dollars provided for the purchase of a home for my wife

Item 6th I hereby constitute my Executor
