Thirdly my will and desire is that the store in the Town of Asheville be carried on agreeably to the articles of Partnership heretofore entered into between myself and Joseph Dunlap until the expiration of the term specified in said article.

I hereby nominate and appoint Joseph Dunlap sole executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 27th day of January 1862.
