

Will Docket September Term A.D 1851

James McBrayer Will:

In the name of God amew. I James McBrayer of the State of North Carolina, being in sound mind and memory blessed by God do the 24<sup>th</sup> June 1839, make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner & form to wit: 1<sup>st</sup> as to what worldly goods it has pleased God to give me, I give and bequeath the manor following after paying all my just debts. 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my beloved wife the plantation whereon I now live, during her lifetime or widowhood, also Mings and Sall during said her lifetime; also what she chooses to keep as she deems necessary for her own use of stock; also plow and boer and farming utensils; also beds and furniture. I will that after my wife Polly has selected what she thinks necessary, the rest be sold and equally be divided amongst my children - to wit: William S. Jane Anna, James M. Elbilly etc, T. Adolphus Martha Andrew H. I will that Betsy's children Henry Ann, James R. Elbilly Thomas and Martha I have Betsy their mother's share equally divided amongst them. 3<sup>rd</sup> I will that after the death of my wife my said be divided as follows: James etc. to have one hundred acres, on the two fifty tract on the Oleylog. Adolphus to have the lower end as far up as the lower elevation inclusive; thence down the water communication to the Creek; thence up the Creek to the upper branch to the south Andrew Heroy the balance of the land.

I will that after the death of my wife all my other property, one negro Mingo be sold and divided between W.C.S., James M., Adolphus, Andrew H. my sons, that Sall be sold & divided between Jane Anna, Elbilly M., T. Martha & C. Betsy him or children have her part.

4<sup>th</sup> I also appoint Sarah Bargen and James Elbilly & Adolphus this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal the day and year above written, signed, sealed in the presence of us, (by the testator James McBrayer) who are present at the signing acknowledging and sealing hereof
