last Will and Testament

Heb 1st

I give and bequeath to my Wife Henriette Neer Patten the follow-  
ing tracts of Land, The first is a tract piece or parcel land  
on the East Side of main street, Beginning at the South West  
corner of Main Street and Tanyard street, South of the Hotel  
running with main street to J W Atthas lot, thence East  
and South with Atthas line to Dr. Leements line and with Dr.  
Leements line East & South to Dr. J. F. C. Hardys line of tract  
purchased of G. B. Leement, and with his line East to the top  
of the Mountain, thence Northwardly with the top or summit of  
the same, to the low gap where the Road comes from Asheville  
to Swannanoa, and to S Lee Esqrs, thence West with the Branch  
to E Claytons line and with his line South & West crossing  
the Branch to my Son James A. Patten line, and with his line  
to Tanyard street and with the same to the Beginning, on  
which is included the mansion house we are now occupying  
to have and to hold and enjoy, with all other buildings and  
every other thing appertaining to the same for her separate and  
benefit and enjoyment during her life (Excepting however  
five acres & ninety rods including the Tanyard as reff-  
erred to Deed of Conveyance to my Son William A. Patten  
of date 1861 will more fully appear) also all that

tract of Land on French Broad river adjoining A. W. Woodfin on  
the North, and the land purchased of the Estate of James H.  
Smith & C. Cunningham on the South and described in  
my book of entry of Lands &c as item 15, but for a more exact  
understanding of the same, after leaving E Cunningham  
Run to run East to the Road leading from James' corner  
joining the new Brock Academy and with the Road to the saw  
mill land and with the line of the same to A. W. Woodfin  
line and with his line West & North to a Black Oak tree  
the original corner of the River tract and west with the same  
line to the French Broad River which tract she is to hold  
& enjoy during her life; I furthermore give and bequeath to her  
all the furniture contained in the House, and all other things in  
use or needed in Kitchen, Stables or any other out buildings, a  
pair of best carriage horses, best carriage & harness, four  
first choice, one four horse wagon & gearing com-  
plete, one

harnes, Six Milch Cows, all the stock of hogs on hand, Implements for farming sufficient to answer her all purposes for the same, good set of Blacksmith tools for one furnace, Provisions, groceries, provender &c sufficient to give an ample supply for twelve months, Also one thousand Dollars Bank Note for stock which certificate she has, and five thousand Dollars in Bonds on the Town of Jacksonville Florida, Also the following Slaves, Isaac Henry, Abram, Sam. Harrison, Ruffin, Isham Coleman, John Johnston, Albert McRae, James Charleston, John Charleston, John Jr., & Nelson, Elvira Males, Jenny Henry, Merritt & her three children, Georgiana, Sarah, & Jane Bell, Eliza, Charlotte, and Margaret now in Charleston, eight females, with all of their future increase, also a child of Margaret, name not known.

## Item 2

I give and bequeath to my son James Alfred Patton, in addition to what has heretofore been received, in Lands and other things, amounting to Sixteen thousand three hundred and thirty two dollars and sixty eight cents, as sufficient to his account on my books, will fully show, in which are the Hotel & Lands on the Mountain, in Deed bearing date the ninth day of November 1860 conveying the same in fee simple, All that lot on the west Side of Main Street including the Brick Stables and corn cribs, South of the Henry Stephen Lot and Patton Street, East of the Episcopal Church Lot and North of a New street running from Main Street west & South of the cribs (Not the shed added by J. H. Blair) and described in book as item 9 Also an undivided half interest, in the tract of land on the West Side of the Bunccombe Turnpike Road & North of Mrs. Vance's lot, Beginning at a stake or stump on the edge of Main road and the North West corner of Mrs. Vance's lot, running West with Mrs. Vance's line, passing her corner 254 poles to an Oak on Mr. Woodfin's line, and the North West corner of the tract purchased from D. H. B. H. Merriman & others, South A. J. Spears & H. Woodfin  
about Ninety three acres, and Known as item 3. The Land so tract  
five acres & Ninety rods and Known as Item 8 which three lots  
are parcels of lands I Conveyed to him on 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1861.  
Also the lot South of the one on which he resides, West Main  
Street, North Church Street & East grave yard fence, & Presbyterian  
Church, including Brock Stone & Battery. Also I gave & devised  
to him the lot No 5 in my Book of Entries of Land Containing

I give and bequeath to my son James Alfred Patton, in addition to what has heretofore been received, in Lands and other things amounting to seventeen thousand three hundred and thirty two dollars and 34<sup>th</sup> eight cents, as sufficient to his account on my books, will fully show, in which are the Hotel & Lands on the Mountain, in Deed bearing date the ninth day of November 1860 Conveying the same in fee simple, All that lot on the west Side of Main Street including the Brock Stables and corn cribs, South of the Henry Stephens Lot and Patton Street, East of the Episcopal Church Lot and North of a new street running from Main Street west & South of the Cribs (Not the shed added by J. H. Blair) and described in book as item 2 Also an undivided half interest, in the Tract of Land on the West Side of the Burnside Turnpike Road & North of Mrs Vance's lot, Beginning at a Stake or stump on the edge of main road and the North West corner of Mrs Vance's lot, running West with Mrs Vance's line, passing her corner 254 poles to an Oak on A.  lot & South of lot No 10, in Book of Land Entries  
 including a Spring and Containing two acres  
 Also an undivided half interest in remainder of two  
 hundred acres of land, Beginning at the South West  
 corner of the tract of 118 acres devised to James A. and  
 W. A. Patton on W. Woodfield's line, thence by his line  
 South to his corner, thence West with his line to the  
 Broad River, thence up the River to the original line  
 of the W. Welch tract, near a large Pine Stump, thence  
 East with the line of the tract bought at sale of  
 J. Mc Smith, heirs, to the North East corner of  
 tract thence an East course to J. Evans lot  
 his lot to the Street

Hence with line of Newwoodfin & others so as to include all that may be obtained from A.W. Woodfin as per agreement for exchange of lands which he holds to the east & west line of the above tract, & with the line of the same to the Beginning the same being given to His Mother for life

Fagg in the following Negroes (viz) Andrew Jackson Ray, James Rice, Henry Ben Robertson, Bob (Carpenter) Susan & six children Jack, Mary, Eliza & child, Also one undivided half of all the chattel property on the premises belonging jointly to me & H. J. Fagg, Also I give & bequeath to him the following Negroes not in Alabama (viz) Isaac Mull, William Harry, Sam Cope, Rachel, Margaret & Emma.

And I in like manner give & devise to my daughter Francis W. Patton a lot in Ashville on the west side of Main Street No 10 in Book of land entries, South of Contemplated New Street between it and No 9 on which the Brick Stable stands East of Church Street & Sullivans lot & North of the plank fence separating the lot above Dr. Willards, Containing about one acre, Also I give and devise to my said daughter the other undivided half interest in remainder in lot No 15 in Book, Containing two hundred acres the other half of which is herein before devised in remainder to Thomas W. Patton by Metes & boundaries with life estate to her Mother Also a tract lying South of Mountain street & west of Road to the top of the Mountain, West & with the Branch to E. Clayton line, North with his line & H. Wilson line to said Mountain Street (Excepting lots sold) containing about forty four acres, Also I devise to my said Daughter the remainder interest after her Mother's death in the tract of land including the Mansion house & appurtenances which is given & devised to her Mother for life in the first item of this will which is referred to for full description thereof by Metes & boundaries Also I give & bequeath to my said daughter the following Negroes (viz) Jo Walton, Marshal, Jerry, Jim Gaston, Woodville, Alfred Alford, Tom Weaver, Mason, John McDowell, Sergeant, Davis, Batey,

Also one New Piano, education & clothing until twenty one years old, a good Saddle Horse Saddle &c worth two hundred dollars.

All the rest & residue of my Estate, Real personal & mixed wherever situated including lands, Negroes, chattels & every interest legal & equitable, I will devise & bequeath to my Executors herein after named & such of them as act & the survivors of them in trust to be sold at public or private sale as they may judge best & the land in tracts, or parts of tracts or lots as they may from time to time judge best & on such terms as they may determine for the interest of the Estate & of the proceeds of such sales & the collections of the debts due to me pay all debts severally me, and the surplus of said funds to pay over to & distribute equally between my said wife, Henrietta Kerr Patton, my son James Alfred Patton, William Augustus Patton, Thomas W. Patton & my daughter, Francis L. Patton, I direct my Executors to keep my Estate together and not to hand over any of the devises or legacies until my Existing Rail Road Contracts in Tennessee & North Carolina are completed and that they comply with my part of those contracts as I understand to do. And I hereby give ample power and discretion to that end & even to consummate in writing the contract with the N. Western R. R. Company according to the written proposition made for myself & J. E. Patton provided the same is fairly carried out as proposed & accepted on the Books of the Company. And I especially request that my son William A. Patton, who has been representing me in prosecuting the work on the said R. R. Contracts will contain so to do as long as consistent with his interest and direct that he be fully compensated therefor and after the said R. R. Contracts are completed the various devises & legacies herein contained shall take effect, but in the mean time the provisions herein made for said wife shall take effect at once or each part thereof as she desires.

The unsettled copartnership & other business between my Brother J. E. Patton & my self, my Executors may defer until the two unfinished Rail Road Contracts are completed & in making such Settlements they must then exercise their discretion, as I have confidence that fairness will be the object of each party.

If for any cause my Executors should think it necessary to sell one or more of the slaves directed to be sold even before the said Rail Road Contracts are completed, for bad or other cause, they are at liberty to do so.

I also give to my said wife the sum of \$1000 in the sum of

in the devise to her for life as well as in remainder to
