eight hundred and forty-one I H. Brittan
of the County of Buncombe in the
State of North Carolina, knowing the
certainty of death, and the uncertainty
of life and being now of reasonable

somewhat impeded by infirmities

But knowing that life is the time to prepare
for death and eternity I this day
make and declare this to be my last Will
and Testament which is as follows: First,
1st it is my will & desire that my body should
be decently buried in my own burying ground
near my two children which is gone before
me my body to the dust & my soul to God,
is my desire and hope
2nd As to my debts thank God I owe none but
good will & shall therefore give my
executors no trouble on that account
3rd It is my will and desire that my daug-
hter Jane Swain & my youngest son George
H. Brittan have all my land where I
now live containing three hundred acres more
or less which they shall and may enjoy
and occupy as joint tenants or divide at
their pleasure so as to be equal, with all my
present stock of every kind consisting of Two
head horse beasts, Twenty-five head cattle,
Twenty-one head of hogs, and Thirtynine head of
sheep with all the increase of each head
of stock, with all my cloths & tools for the
use of all, & each shall be vested in the aforesaid
Jane Swain and Geo. H. Brittan to do I dispose of at
their own will and pleasure, with all my house
hold & kitchen furniture & all other of my property
which I now possess not herein named to be
equally divided between them as they may
please.

Provided that my said daughter Jane Swain
& my son Geo. H. Brittan doth maintain me and my
wife decently & comfortably during our lifetime
as would become dutiful children & further comply
with all the requisitions of this my last will &
Testament, or the same shall be void and of no
effect.

4th It is my desire that my daughter Jane Swain
& my son Geo. H. Brittan should have and possess
from this time all of the Estate & property equal

Woodcock, late of Buncombe County, North Carolina, died in the year 1889, leaving a Last Will and Testament bearing date June 29, 1888, which Last Will and Testament appears of record in the Office of the Clerk of the Superior Court for Buncombe County, North Carolina, in Record of Wills B at Page 538;

And it further appearing to the Court that the due execution of said Last Will and Testament of J. A. Woodcock was duly proven on September 3, 1889 before W. J. Reynolds, who was then the Clerk of said Court, by the oath & examination of Henry G. Chandler and J. H. Cobb, the subscribing Witnesses to said Will, said proof of execution being in writing, duly subscribed and sworn to before said Clerk and recorded in the office of the Clerk of Superior Court of Buncombe County North Carolina in Record of Wills B at Page 538;

And it further appearing to the Court that Julia E. Woodcock, the Executrix named in said Will, duly qualified as Executrix thereof and that the record of her Qualification appears in the records of this Court in said Record of Wills B at Page 539;

And it further appearing to the Court that no Order of Probate of said Will appears on the records of this Court and that if any such Order was issued the same has been lost and cannot be located;

And it further appearing to the Court that said Last Will and Testament of J. A. Woodcock, deceased, is in due form of law and is duly executed and published by the Testator and duly witnessed by the Witnesses thereto and the proof of the execution of said Will has been duly and regularly made according to law;

It is, Therefore, Considered And Adjudged by the Court that said paper writing bearing date June 29, 1888 on file in this Court and recorded as above set out and every part thereof is the Last Will and Testament of J. A. Woodcock, deceased, and is admitted to probate as such.
