istrators, and assigns, absolutely forever.

2. In case my son in law, Dr. Richmond L. Lenoir
shall be owing to me any sum of money at the time
of my decease, I enact that my executor to defer
and postpone the making payment of the same
for twelve months from my death.

3. I have appointed and have appointed, Francis White,
the sole Executor of this will.
