First, I give and devise all my real and personal
estate of what nature or kind so ever, to my sister, Mrs.
Sarah A. Chapman and her two sons Charly and Frank Chap-
man my executors hereunto appointed, in trust, for the
execution of my will, with power to sell and dispose
of the same at public or private sale at such time, and
upon such terms, and in such manner as to them shall
seem meet, and I direct that the proceeds of any all sales
made by virtue hereof as well as any debt or other property
that may come into their hands shall be disposed of as
follows; the interest and income thereof shall be paid
to my two sisters Sarah A. Chapman and Eliza Coratti
in equal shares for and during the term of their
natural lives, the surviving sister to have the sole

life. Upon the death of the surviving sister, I direct
that all the residue of my estate shall be equally
