Buncombe County }
I John Chambers of the County and State aforesaid
being the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death,
feared to consider the many difficulties which arises from
the neglect of men not preparing in time for difficulties
after death, to their families in the distribution of their
worldly substance and believing it to be my duty inasmuch
as I am truly afflicted in body but of sound and disposing
Mind and Memory (Thanks be to God) do this twenty second
day of December in the year of our Lord our Thousand
Eight hundred and forty three make and declare this to be
my last will and testament in the following manner to wit
I bequeath my soul to God who gave it being and
my body to the dust to be interred in the burying ground
at Flat Creek Meeting house in a plain and decent
manner (if I should die at home or in reach of it)
It is my wife's desire that my just debts should
be paid first out of my estate (and especially four dollars
which I owe the Bible Society if not paid before my
dissolution)

It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Rebecca
Chambers shall enjoy and possess all my estate during her
natural lifetime or widowhood, so as not to leave more on
one child than another but as they may marry and leave
her what ever she may give to them to be considered as
so much of their distribution share of my estate personal
estate

It is further my will and desire that when my estate
be divided after my wife's death or widowhood, it be divided
in the following manner among my children and wife
if she should be alive. I wish the tract of land where
I now live to be divided equal in point of value between
my two sons William A. Chambers and John A. Chambers
and if they cannot agree themselves in the division to
leave it to two or three disinterested men chosen by themselves
and if my wife should not choose to remain a widow
after my death it is my desire that she should have equal
with my daughters in all my personal property in manner
and form herein after mentioned described, that is that all my
personal estate be sold & my executors (hereafter named) in
the best time then meet to sell the same

according to my will and desire.
