

The last Will and Testament of John
Conly of Buncombe County & State
of North Carolina.
February 6, A.D. 1882.

I, John Conly, of Buncombe County &
State of North Carolina, do make this
my last Will and Testament:-

- 1 I desire authorize my Executor to sell
all debts due and due dispose of the same
as herein directed.
- 2 My executor is herein directed to pay all
my just debts and for that purpose to
dispose of such of my property by sale
or otherwise as may be necessary to secure
the payment.
- 3 I will and bequeath to my Executor in
trust for her life time to my wife Barbara
have all the estate and property of which I
may die possessed, after the payment of my
debts, and I herein direct my Executor,
if he, in his judgment should see fit, to
sell any or all of the property thus given
in trust and direct the proceeds, taking
good and sufficient security, and out of the
income thereof to pay my wife Barbara
such what may be necessary for her
maintenance and support. After the death of
my wife Barbara then, I herein direct
my executor to divide the property or sell it
and divide the proceeds, (selling either at public
or private sale) among my surviving children
or their surviving children or their representatives
and my Executor is herein ~~authorized~~ directed
the property or the proceeds of it into eight
shares, giving one share to each of my
daughters: Jane Baxter, Harriet Sammons,
Margaret Mills, Victoria Wilson, Martha
Pearson, Emma Boyer, Leon Wilson,
and one share to my son, George Conly.

was of sound mind and memory of
age and legal capacity to execute a will, and was not
